1. Call to Order

4. NPSC Indigenous Education Initiatives Updates

a. NPSC TRC

- i. Jody Weller will update the document and bring to the committee in June.
- ii. An addition to the document Indigenous Student Trustee ensures representation of FNMI student voice.
- iii. Document will be brought to June meeting to reflect connected learning in Indigenous culture.

Next Action: Bring summary document back in June.

b. Board Action Plan

- i. Jody provided an update that all activities are being implemented as planned; educator retreat in fall 2018 was very successful.
- ii. Plans for the Junior Student Retreat are underway for June 6, 2019.

Next Action: Bring BAP to June meeting to reflect initiative for the 2018-2019 school year.

5. Ministry of Education Updates

a. Provincial Overview 2019-2020

- i. GSN Memo received April 26, 2019 and Priorities and Partnerships Fund Memo received April 26, 2019. Both memos provided broad overview of funding, still awaiting technical details.
- ii. A broad overview of the areas of funding were released. Class size through attrition, Priorities and Partnership Funds (PPFs) to focus on particular areas, Grade 9-12 Indigenous Studies curriculum implementation and some PD support. Indigenous Education strategic priorities included funding for the Indigenous Graduation Coach and Indigenous Youth Entrepreneurship

b. Indigenous Grad Coach

- i. Pilot provides supports to Indigenous learners with the goal of obtaining an OSSD. Also supports successful transition into the provincially funded secondary school system as well as to post-secondary education, training or labour market opportunities.
- ii. Key component of the pilot is the Indigenous Graduation Coach has deeply rooted ties to an Indigenous community or communities and to Indigenous cultures.
- iii. The Coach acts as a mentor and an advisor to students, facilitating access and referrals to academic supports and community resources. The Coach also plays an essential role as an advocate for each learner with teachers, other staff and families. Indigenous Grad coach to be important member of the student success and guidance team.
- iv. NPSC was selected to be one of the recipient boards for the plans for summer months are underway.



c. Curriculum

- Use the same model as occurred in the elementary revisions and funding will be received to support implementation of Grade 9-12 Indigenous Studies curriculum.
- ii. Social Studies/History/Geography Curriculum Writing Team continues to be postponed. We are awaiting further updates.

6. AES Update

- a. AES Symposium
 - i. Nancy Allaire updated the committee and highlighted the AES website.
 - ii. Student Voice guide decisions around programming and curriculum writing. NPSC student trustee K. George was in attendance as a youth representative. Student voice continues to be paramount.

7. Other

a. OCSTA Guest Speaker

Judy shared a speaker Maggie MacDonnell who shared her teaching experience in Nunavut. Her journey involved teaching students with high risk. She was very inspirational speaker. The strategies on engagement and re-engagement she shared really showed how much she believed in the students and that she never gave up on them. A powerful message and journey.

b. Education Services Agreement
