7. CORRESPONDENCE

a) Brant Haldimand Norfolk CDSB – May 26, 2021

Ms. Weller shared The Brant Haldimand Norfolk CDSB letter endorsing Bill 172, the Education Statute Law Amendment Act regarding Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD). This proposed legislation will require all boards of education in Ontario to develop policies and guidelines with respect to FASD and require the ON College of Teachers and ECE programs to provide training with respect to FASD.

b) Durham District School Board - May 28, 2021

Ms. Weller shared the DDSB letter to the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services requesting clarification on the implementation of the needs-based funding regarding service provision for children with a diagnosis of ASD – New Pilot Program.

8. INFORMATION ITEMS

a) Board Report

i) Superintendent's Update

Youth Vaccine Program:

To ensure as many youth as possible are fully vaccinated before the start of the school year, the province is providing a first dose to all willing youth aged 12 to 17 during a two week period beginning June 14th, and a second dose before the end of August 2021.

End of Year Celebrations:

The Ontario Ministry of Education is working with school boards and the Ontario Ministry of Health to provide guidance on the implementation of end of year celebrations. Specific communication will be provided to school communities in the very near future.

2021-2022 School Year Survey:

The Ontario Ministry of Education has confirmed that school boards will provide an option to families for remote or virtual learning for the 2021-2022 school year. It is important to note that all NPSC schools are planning for a full in-person return to school in September. All parents and guardians are required to declare which learning mode they have chosen for their children by completing a survey (one survey, per child), which is open until June 9. The survey is available on <u>our website at npsc.ca</u>. If families are unable to access the survey online, please contact your child's school and a staff member will complete the survey with you over the phone.

Reopening Ontario - Step 1:

Ms. Weller shared that the Province of Ontario will be moving to Step 1 of the roadmap on June 11, 2021 at 12:01 AM. This is an initial focus on resuming outdoor activities with smaller crowds where the risk of transmission is lower, and permitting limited retail with restrictions. This includes: outdoor gatherings of up to 10 people, outdoor dining with up to four people per table and non-essential retail at 15% capacity.

ii) Coordinator's Update

Ms. Bitonti shared that NPSC is in the process of gathering referrals for the Special Education 2020-2021 Summer Programs:

Virtual Evidence – Based Reading Intervention

- early intervention for struggling readers for students entering Grades 1 to 3
- supporting students with special education needs who are struggling with reading
- embedding social emotional learning skills

<u>Virtual Summer Programming for Students with Complex Needs</u>

- offering hands on synchronous activities led by qualified teachers and a team of paraprofessionals
- provide opportunities to build communication and socialization skills geared to promoting continuity of success
- opportunities include baking, dance, crafts, music, yoga

On Site Transition Program

- will occur the last 2 weeks of August and provide in person opportunities for students with complex special education or well-being needs
- qualified teachers will facilitate exposure to classroom-based routines, expectations and learning opportunities to strengthen school readiness

iii) Secondary Lead's Update

- Jennifer Palangio award has been created this year and will be presented at this year's award ceremony
- Transition meetings occurring during the last week of school for incoming LAC students (virtually)
- Many students will be enrolled in summer programs being offered through NPSC
- 2 students will be graduating from the LAC program this year at SJSH
